# April Marks Paralyzed Veterans of America Awareness Month

Throughout the month of April, Paralyzed Veterans of America (PVA) and its 33 chapters across the country will be highlighting the unique challenges veterans with spinal cord injury or disease (SCI/D) face, and how people can get involved and help. According to the Department of Veterans Affairs, approximately 44,000 veterans live with spinal cord injury or disease. Paralyzed Veterans of America is the only veteran's organization dedicated to serving veterans with SCI/D.

This April, during Paralyzed Veterans Awareness Month, we're encouraging the public to really get involved and learn about the unique challenges paralyzed veterans face and how they can help and give back to support these veterans. We will also be celebrating the accomplishments of some of our veteran members living with spinal cord injury and all that they have achieved despite their disability.

Our members are active and playing sports, some aspiring to compete at the Paralympic level; they are going back to work in fulfilling jobs and careers; some are starting their own successful businesses, or going back to school to earn their degree; and many are continuing to give back and serve other fellow paralyzed veterans to let them know that life is not over after injury." Paralyzed Veterans are encouraging the public to get involved and support our nation's paralyzed veterans by doing one of the following:

**Hire a Veteran:** if you run a business, consider hiring a veteran. Paralyzed Veterans' Operation PAVE (Paving Access for Veterans Employment) program works directly with employers to find qualified employees.

# Paralyzed Veterans of America North Central Chapter "Darrell Jepson Memorial" Educational Student Scholarship Program

#### Introduction

The goal of this scholarship program is to assist in providing education and training for veterans with spinal cord injury and diseases of the central nervous system as well as members of their families.

The Paralyzed Veterans of America North Central Chapter will review all applications and will determine the amount of funding each applicant will receive.

### Eligible Applicants

- All applicants must be citizens of the United States.
- Applicants must be accepted or enrolled as a full-time student at any accredited college, university, vocational school or online courses in the United States.
- Applicants must complete their first year of post-secondary study prior to application. Under no circumstances will scholarship awards be given for more than two (2) years.
- Preference will be given to applicants pursuing degrees as Registered Nurses, Occupational Therapists and Physical Therapists.
- Scholarship recipients must notify PVA North Central Chapter if they are no longer enrolled in school.
- Selection shall be made without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, veteran status.
- If the member is deceased, applications will be denied unless the member was active with the Chapter.

#### General Guidelines

Amount of funds available will be determined by the PVA North Central Chapter Board of Directors. Scholarships will vary according to the number and merit of applications received and the total funds available. At no time will a grant exceed \$1,000.00 per academic year.

Students must provide a copy of the transcript of grades from the previous semester in order to obtain funding for the upcoming semester. Checks will be made payable to the college. Under no circumstances will payment be made to the student.

Students will receive one half the scholarship amount each semester after providing their previous grade transcript (must obtain a 2.0 or more g.p.a.), registration, and proof of enrollment.

Application forms may be obtained from the PVA North Central Chapter, 209 N. Garfield Ave., Sioux Falls, SD 57104.

Applications must be postmarked by July 1st. There will be no exceptions.

Event: Community Action for Veterans Conference

Dates: September 22-23, 2025

Location: Denny Sanford Premier Center

Description: The Community Action for Veterans Conference is a two-day professional development event designed to empower service providers to better support military families and veterans, especially in rural communities. This conference will bring together social workers, healthcare providers, educators, nonprofit leaders, and policymakers to share best practices, build collaborative networks, and enhance access to vital resources for military-connected individuals.

In addition, the conference will feature a VA 1-on-1: Veterans Assistance Expo, where VA staff, veteran service organizations, community service providers, and government partners will offer direct services, resources, and information.

### LEARNING STRANDS

Mental Health: Exploring strategies for addressing the mental health needs of military families and veterans, with a focus on military cultural responsiveness, trauma-informed care, and effective suicide prevention approaches.

Rural Challenges: Addressing the barriers and solutions to improving healthcare access, social support, and resource availability for veterans and military families living in rural communities.

Caregiving and Military Family Life: Empowering military caregivers and families by providing resources, support systems, and understanding of the impacts of military life on family dynamics and well-being.

# From the Office of Brad Friez National Service Officer

We wanted to go over some basics about Veterans benefits for Veterans and other family member clients of our office.

When we represent a Veteran or other client we help them complete their Power of Attorney form (VA Form 21-22) along with the Intent to File a Claim Form (VA Form 21-0966). The POA form allows us to represent an individual before the VA and the Intent to File form gives that person an effective date for one year for the VA benefit they are attempting to obtain if we do submit that claim within that year period of time. IE – if we were to submit the Intent to File form on April 15, 2025 we would have until April 14, 2026 to submit a claim and then the effective date would be then on April 15, 2025. The VA will send out a form letter in response reflecting the Intent to File Form had been received and encourage that individual to follow through with an actual claim for benefits. The VA form letter will be sent out to that person within about two weeks of when the Intent to File form had been submitted to the VA. Many individuals will reach out to our office with the mistaken belief that the Intent to File is actually the claim when in reality it is a pre-curser form to the claim. The claim form will still need to be submitted. The one-year time of the Intent to File form allows us and the client to gather all the necessary evidence in advance of submitting the eventual claim.

Many times, we are not able to reach our Veterans and clients of the office because we do not have the current contact information. Thus, it is very important to notify our office and the VA Hospital and Regional Office of current contact information to include address, cell/home phone numbers, and your email address. Additionally, please make sure your voice messaging systems on home and cell phones are set up and cleared out occasionally. Also, if the VA is paying benefits you need to ensure they are aware of any changes to your family size. Lastly, it is strongly suggested to schedule an appointment for assistance with your VA benefits and if you are not able to make it to that appointment, please inform our office of that need to cancel that appointment.

I also wanted to express my condolences for those of us impacted by the recent passing of Rick Barge and Don Loudner. Rick was the long time Quartermaster of the VFW in South Dakota.Don was the first National Commander of the Native American Indian Veterans, Inc. (NAIV).

### Governor Larry Rhoden signs senate bill 52

Governor Larry Rhoden has officially signed Senate Bill 52 into law, a critical piece of legislation that will allow for the expansion of the South Dakota Veterans Cemetery. This move is designed to address the need for additional space, ensuring that the cemetery can continue to serve veterans and their families for years to come.

It's important to note that, based on current utilization trends, the need for expanding other burial areas at the cemetery is not anticipated within the next eight to ten years. This makes the expansion of columbarium space the priority, as it directly addresses the issue of space shortages for cremated remains.

The signing of SB 52 is only the first step in the expansion process. The next crucial step will be for the South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs to apply for a grant from the National Cemetery Administration. Governor Rhoden has been a strong advocate for South Dakota's veterans, and his signing of SB 52 underscores his continued commitment to providing the necessary resources and support to those who have served in the armed forces.

By ensuring that the South Dakota Veterans Cemetery has the space it needs to accommodate future burials, Governor Rhoden is helping to guarantee that the state remains a place where veterans are honored and remembered. "The South Dakota Veterans Cemetery will remain a vital and respected place for veterans to rest, as well as a symbol of the state's gratitude for their sacrifices.






