

We want to give a big thanks to our National Director, Greg Brandner, who recently attended the Paralyzed Veterans of America (PVA) Annual National Convention in Austin, TX, from May 13-17. This event brought together representatives from chapters across the country to discuss key initiatives and advancements in supporting our nation's heroes.

A notable highlight from the convention was the outstanding participation in PVA's research and education grants, with a remarkable 100% participation rate from all chapters. This achievement underscores the organization's commitment to advancing the well-being and care of veterans with spinal cord injuries and disorders.

National PVA leadership expressed concerns about the lack of data on the "return on investment" for various programs and services. To address this, efforts are underway to collect comprehensive data and metrics from bedside to end of life, focusing on initiatives such as the Air Care Act, PVA Games, and assistance with benefits. This data-driven approach will help inform future decisions and optimize resources.

While in Austin, Greg had the opportunity to connect with Scott Griffith, National Director of the Wisconsin Chapter. The two shared a moment of camaraderie, captured in the photo below. Interestingly, Greg has a special connection to the Wisconsin Chapter, having served as its first president from 1980-1981. We're proud of Greg's participation in the convention and his ongoing efforts to advance PVA's mission. Stay tuned for future updates on the impact of these initiatives and the difference they're making in the lives of Veterans.



GOVERNMENT RELATIONS

Veteran Usability Recruiting Opportunity

PVA recently participated in a briefing by VA's Section 508 Compliance Office, which ensures systems and information technology platforms are compliant with federal laws related to digital accessibility. According to the office, their efforts have increased website compliance from 26 percent in 2022 to 98 percent today.

The VA would like to hear from veterans about the accessibility barriers they encounter. Participating in user experience research studies provides them with a direct link to veterans about how they engage with VA platforms, apps, and other VA systems. If you would like to participate in the user experience studies, visit https://veteranusability.us/.

After registering, you'll be asked to fill out a Participant Recruiting Screener Questionnaire which will determine your eligibility for specific studies. The VA will send studies that align with the responses given in the Screener Questionnaire to further determine your eligibility for participation in each study.

ASSIST ACT INTRODUCED IN THE SENATE

On May 13, Sen. Tommy Tuberville (R-AL) introduced the Automotive Support Services to Improve Safe Transportation (ASSIST) Act (S. 1726) in the Senate. In 2023, Congress passed legislation that was intended to codify the adaptations VA could provide to disabled veterans to modify their vehicles as part of the department's medical benefits package.

VA has determined that the examples of what modifications were allowed inadvertently restricted the program to the items listed which was not Congress's intent. The ASSIST Act clarifies the language regarding the types of adaptive equipment that can be provided to disabled veterans under the medical benefits package.

On May 19, H.R. 1364, the House of Representative's version of the ASSIST Act passed unanimously.

PVA Holds Annual Advocacy/Legislation Seminar

On June 10-12, PVA held the 2025 Advocacy Legislation Seminar in Washington, DC. Over 150 PVA members and chapter leaders and staff participated in the event.

Attendees visited the offices of over 300 members of Congress. PVA's priorities included preserving VA's spinal cord injuries and disorders (SCI/D) system of care, increasing disability access in VA, and improving access to housing and vehicle modifications.

House Passes Legislation Supporting Employment of People With Disabilities

The first week of June, the House of Representatives passed several pieces of legislation, most of which related to the Small Business Administration (SBA).

One of these bills, H.R 1634, the Think DIFFERENTLY About Disability Employment Act, would establish a memorandum of understanding (MOU) between the SBA and the National Council on Disability. The MOU seeks to provide assistance for people with disabilities who are interested in becoming entrepreneurs or who want to be self-employed.

It would also help small businesses with hiring individuals with disabilities and increase accessibility for the workplace. Additionally, it increases outreach and education to help more people with disabilities access information about how to become business owners.

H.R. 1621, the Entrepreneurs with Disabilities Report Act of 2025, also passed the House. This bill would require the SBA to submit a report to Congress highlighting challenges faced by entrepreneurs with disabilities. These bills will now move to the Senate for further consideration.

FRAUD ALERT !!!

Protect Veterans from Pension Poaching

The VA Office of Inspector General (OIG) cautions veterans to be alert to a form of financial exploitation known as "pension poaching." VA pension benefits are available to wartime veterans or their surviving spouses who meet certain age or disability requirements and have limited income and net worth.

Veterans are targets of a wide range of pension-poaching schemes, all of which attempt to steal their assets. Frequently, scammers promote suspect legal or financial products or services that are designed to qualify otherwise ineligible individuals for a VA pension, either by falsifying financial information or restructuring assets to meet criteria.

Others may charge large fees to represent unsuspecting veterans in pursuing pension benefits for which they may not qualify. Some may also try to sell in-home care to eligible pension recipients that may be overpriced or is never provided.

Scams often start with a dishonest lawyer, financial planner, or insurance agent soliciting veterans through cold calls, mail campaigns, or in-person encounters at a senior center or assisted living facility. Steer clear of and report to the OIG individuals and organizations that

- claim to guarantee eligibility for a particular benefit;
- encourage false reporting of income and expense information, reallocating assets to trusts, or purchasing annuities to qualify for a VA pension;
- charge upfront fees or a percentage of any awarded benefit to file VA claims or applications (free help is available from VA-accredited individuals and entities);
- · apply pressure to provide sensitive financial information like credit card numbers; or
- attempt to redirect VA deposits to a bank account controlled by a caregiver, power of attorney, claim representative, or anyone other than the rightful beneficiary.

From the Office of Brad Friez National Service Officer

For this edition of the PVA Chapter Newsletter I wanted to go over the Caregiver Support Program among other topics. It seems that there is a fair amount of confusion about this VA benefit. There are actually two programs, the Program of General Caregiver Supportive Services (PGCSS) that just provides support with no stipend or application required and the Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers (PCAFC) which includes all the services PGCSS with the addition of a stipend for the caregiver to care for the Veteran in the home rather than them going to a nursing home or mental health facility.

To apply for PCAFC, the Veteran must be 70% rated or higher. Those 60% + unemployability DO NOT qualify as they would for contract nursing home. They must also be receiving care from a caregiver in the home for a minimum of six continuous months. The application is VA form 10-10CG. Veterans can also apply at www.caregiver.va.gov.

Once the application is submitted the Veteran and Caregiver participate in a series of assessments to determine if the Veteran meets the clinical eligibility for the program. Veterans must be in need of hands-on assistance on a daily basis with one activity of daily living (feeding themselves, dressing, bathing, going to the bathroom, grooming themselves, or moving) OR they have some sort of condition that makes it unsafe for the Veteran to be left alone. The Veteran's functioning is looked at NOT their diagnosis. This is determined through a review of the assessments and the Veteran's medical records by a VISN based eligibility team.


If the application is denied, the Veteran and Caregiver can reapply any time and as many times as they like. They also have the option appeal the denial through a variety of avenues. It is strongly suggested that Veterans utilize both clinical appeals through VHA first as these appeals are processed in 45 days versus going straight to the Board of Veterans Appeals path. The Board of Veterans Appeals typically takes years. But the clinical appeals cannot include additional evidence but basically a restating of the evidence of record at the time of the original application. For appeals submitted at the Sioux Falls VA which only requires a letter to the patient advocate, the first clinical appeal goes to the eligibility team at VISN 10 which covers Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan and Ohio. If the first clinical appeal is denied, the same process can be followed to submit a second appeal to VISN 20 which covers Alaska, Washington, Oregon, and small parts of Montana and California.

If an appeal is submitted to the Board of Veterans Affairs, the Veteran forfeits all other appeal options. This appeal also must be filed within a year from the decision date. You can always call the national caregiver support line if you have more detailed questions about appeals, 1-855-260-3274.



 - -Form DD1300 or DIC eligibility letter
- •Household annual income must be below 250% of the federal poverty guidelines table issued by the Department of Health and Human Services.
 - -See Poverty Guidelines (click "Chart Showing different multiples of poverty guidelines ..." under "Files").
- •Have a clean driving record—no major infractions in the past seven years.
 - -"Major infractions" may include, but are not limited to, operating a vehicle under the influence of alcohol or illegal substances, driving with a suspended, revoked, or invalid license, and reckless driving.
- •Does not own a vehicle or is able to demonstrate an existing hardship with current vehicle.
- •Be able to provide their most recent federal income tax filing or current VA benefit statement.
- Be able to pass a background check of entire adult life span, which will include, but is not limited to, any criminal activity.
- •Be at least eighteen (18) years old or the age of majority in their state of residence (which is nineteen [19] for residents of Alabama and Nebraska).
- •Be a legal resident of the fifty (50) United States (including the District of Columbia).




